The HSBA Leadership Institute is designed to foster professional growth and enhance leadership skills of future leaders from all areas of the Bar. The Institute includes diverse leaders of the bar who have a keen interest in expanding their talents and services to the bar and community at large. Up to 15 fellows are chosen annually, who spend four hours per month interacting with presenters. Programs are facilitated by bar members and feature prominent leaders of the legal profession and the greater community. At the end of the program, each fellow is required to develop and undertake an approved project based on what has been learned and demonstrating their commitment to leadership.

Application: Applicants must be an HSBA attorney who is in good standing, has practiced 3-15 years and can commit to attend all sessions of the program. The selection process is competitive, based on resume submissions and the program application. Deadline for applications – check website (early spring?).

Patsy T. Mink Leadership Alliance

This is a 10 Month program for emerging women leaders committed to personal growth, professional impact and community change. The program develops management and leadership skills to increase the representation of women executives in Hawaii. The program requires attendance at 15 of 17 programs in order to graduate. Business leadership skills training will include topics ranging from Leading Authentically, Emotional Intelligence, Leveraging Your Talents, Social Capital Building, Design Thinking, Strategic Planning, Leading a Collaborative Team, HR as a Strategic Business Partner, Business/Government Intersection, Principles of Negotiation, Financial Business Acumen, and Entrepreneurial Thinking. Program cost is \$3,000.

Application: Desired traits include leadership potential, ambition, forward thinker, lifelong learner, and those wanting to make a positive difference in the lives of others. Deadline for application – check website (usually June 30th).

Hawaii Asia-Pacific Affairs Leadership Program

This program seeks to help the next generation of Hawaii's leaders develop a solid knowledge base of the major political, economic, and security issues in the Asia Pacific. Up to 12 participants annually have access to Pacific Forum's international network of senior foreign policy experts, emerging next-generation scholars and practitioners, and other community leaders and executives, and will have access to exclusive, invitation-only Pacific Forum conferences and events normally limited to seasoned experts and high-level donors. Participants meet on weeknights 1-2 times a month from September to May for roundtable discussions focused on key Asia-Pacific issues. Participants may also be invited to optional breakfast briefings on weekdays.

Application: Eligible persons are undergraduate students, graduate students with limited experience in the field, and young professionals. Deadline – check website (usually in the spring-summer).

Pacific Century Fellows

This program seeks to develop leaders with a greater awareness and sensitivity to the people and institutions of Hawaii, by bringing together annually up to 32 of Hawaii's most promising individuals from all walks of life, fields and professions, to gain a broader view of civic duty through direct contact with senior community, social and government leaders. This is a nine month program beginning with a two day retreat, then an all-day session once-a-month will address a particular subject such as education, government, healthcare and quality of life. Participants must be able to attend the opening retreat and the vast majority of day long sessions, and are encouraged to take a more active public service role. Program cost is \$3,800.

Application: Applicants should be in their late-20's to early-40's, in the middle stages of their careers from all segments of the community, and should demonstrate the ability to set and achieve goals and possess strong leadership qualities in their professional, volunteer or civic activities. Application deadline – check website (usually June 30).

Young Leaders Program (CSIS)

This program helps train young professionals in international policy affairs at an early juncture in their careers and enhances cross-cultural opportunities for young scholars and foreign policy professionals to improve their policy analysis skills at an early juncture in their careers. This helps participants build networks, observe foreign-policy making process, and gain a deeper understanding of serious conflicts and issues in the Asia-Pacific region, as well as to learn how experts and leaders deal with these problems, and develop and articulate personal perspectives on these issues. Participants have access to 25+ conferences and events that Pacific Forum CSIS conducts each year, and can be as involved as time time permits. Conferences usually take 3-5 days each (most young leaders do not attend more than one or two annually).

Application: Applicants should be at the beginning stages of his or her career, with a Bachelors' degree and has several years of relevant professional experience in Asia Pacific security issues, or have completed or in the process of completing a master's or PhD degree in similar areas. The ideal age range is from 25-35, but with flexibility based on the applicant's level of experience. Applicants should demonstrate an aptitude for international diplomacy; an interest in Asia-Pacific security issues; a desire to learn and gain leadership experience; and strong communication and teamwork skills.

Omidyar Fellows

This is a 15 month leadership development program for seasoned professionals, followed by expected continuing engagement with other Fellows. The curriculum includes a full-day session and evening session once a month (with the exception of a two-month window during which individual learning excursions will take place). One-on-one executive coaching occurs between sessions and reading, writing, and other exercises are required. The total time commitment is about 15 hours per month. The program includes a curriculum in cross-cultural competencies and an individual learning excursion off-island.

Application: Candidates must have at least ten years of professional experience leading and engaging others in for-profit, nonprofit, labor union, or government sectors and must be able to demonstrate how their achievements hold the promise of extraordinary leadership for Hawaii in the decades ahead. The application package and deadlines (May-June) are detailed on the website.
